

EVACUATION INFORMATION

Category 1 and 2 Hurricanes

- All coastal barrier islands.
- All mobile homes.
- All properties within a block of a coastal/tidal body of water.
- All areas prone to flooding.



Category 3, 4, and 5 Hurricanes

All areas evacuated in Category 1 and

2 hurricanes in addition to:

- All areas east of US 1/Federal Highway within the city limits of Boca Raton.

HURRICANE PREPARATIONS:

- Decide on an evacuation plan well in advance as a precautionary measure.
- Fuel up vehicles and propane tanks; obtain fuel for generators.
- Protect your windows with shutters or plywood.
- Prepare containers of drinking water. Plan on 3 gallons per person per day.
- Clean and fill your bathtub so you can use the water for washing & flushing.
- Plan to take care of yourself and your family without outside assistance for a minimum of five to seven days.
- Stock up on important prescription medications. A four week supply, in the original bottles is recommended.
- Bring outdoor furnishings indoors or secure properly.
- Decide on a safe room - an interior room such as a bathroom or walk-in closet.
- Stay away from windows, skylights and glass doors.
- If you have double-entry doors, protect them as you would a window with shutters or plywood, or nail 2' x 4's across them from the inside on storm day to prevent them from blowing in.
- If the power goes out, turn off the stove and appliances. That will avoid a fire hazard when the power comes back on.
- Know where to shut off power and water.
- Do not drain your pool completely; lower water level 6 to 12 inches and add extra chlorine to prevent contamination. Turn off electricity to equipment and cover pool pump, if exposed.
- Keep vital documents close at hand.
- Turn refrigerator and freezer to coldest setting; open only when necessary and close quickly. Freeze plastic jugs of water.

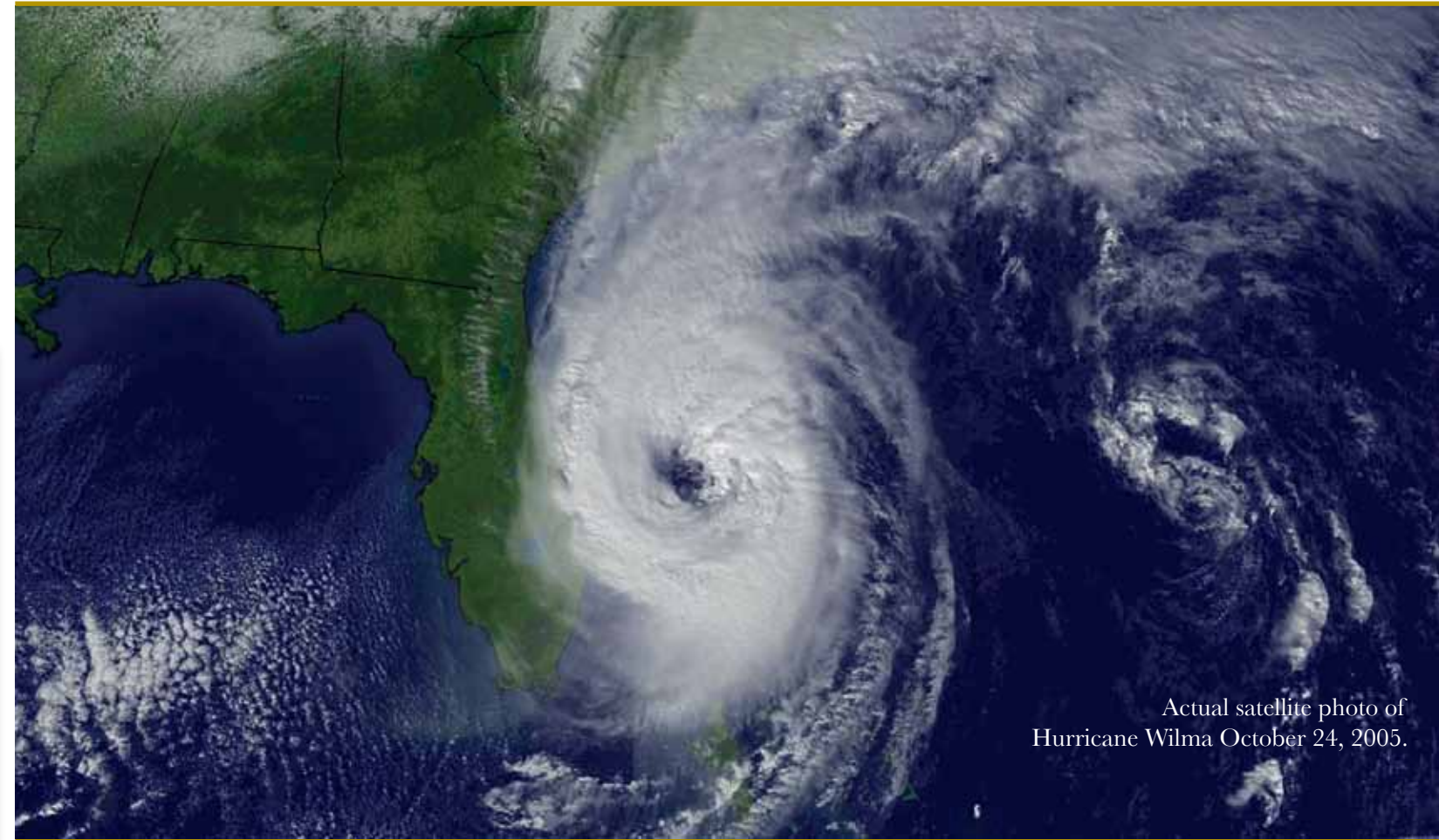

- Category 1 74 - 95 mph wind speed 4 - 5ft. storm surge
- Category 2 96 - 110 mph wind speed 6 - 8ft. storm surge
- Category 3 111 - 130 mph wind speed 9 - 12ft. storm surge
- Category 4 131 - 155 mph wind speed 13 - 18ft. storm surge
- Category 5 155+ mph wind speed 18ft.+ storm surge
